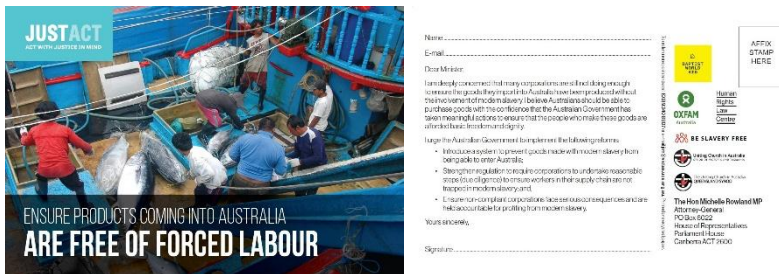

Dear Attorney-General,

I am deeply concerned that many corporations are still not doing enough to ensure the goods they import into Australia have been produced without the involvement of modern slavery. I believe Australians should be able to purchase goods with the confidence that the Australian Government has taken meaningful actions to ensure that the people who make these goods are afforded basic freedom and dignity.

I urge the Australian Government to implement the following reforms:

- Introduce a system to prevent goods made with modern slavery from being able to enter Australia;
- Strengthen regulation to require corporations to undertake reasonable steps (due diligence) to ensure workers in their supply chain are not trapped in modern slavery; and,
- Ensure non-compliant corporations face serious consequences and are held accountable for profiting from modern slavery.
