- 2. That our structural life as a church is one that reflects the extravagant hospitality of God so that the particular and unique contributions from our CALD communities to the life and ministry of the Uniting Church is welcomed and engaged with.
- 3. To establish deep connections between CALD communites and the First Peoples of this land
- 4. To reach out and be a voice in the wider community, especially in the area of CALD women ministry

Recommendations/issues to be addressed:

- 1. Enabling and empowering women in CALD communities for ministry leadership and service in the secular community
- 2. Establishing a leadership network for emerging leaders (2nd and 3rd generations) from CALD communities.
